#### Gumball Machines, Past, Present and Future


The arrangement is with the Ford Gumball Company and has been in place in Burlington since the 1950's in its current form. John Dodge has worked on the project for nearly 20 years and during that time Richard and Carol Olson of Reasnor, IA have owned the franchise with Ford and provided service for our machines.

There are currently approximately 60 locations in town that host the machines. That is down by half since I started working with the program. During that time the price has gone from a penny on most machines to dime and quarter machines. Income from the program is currently about \$700.00 per year, also down by half.

In this past year Richard lost a long battle with cancer and passed away leaving his wife Carol to run their business on her own until a new buyer can be found. It is unclear at this time if the program can be continued or how it might be managed in the future.
