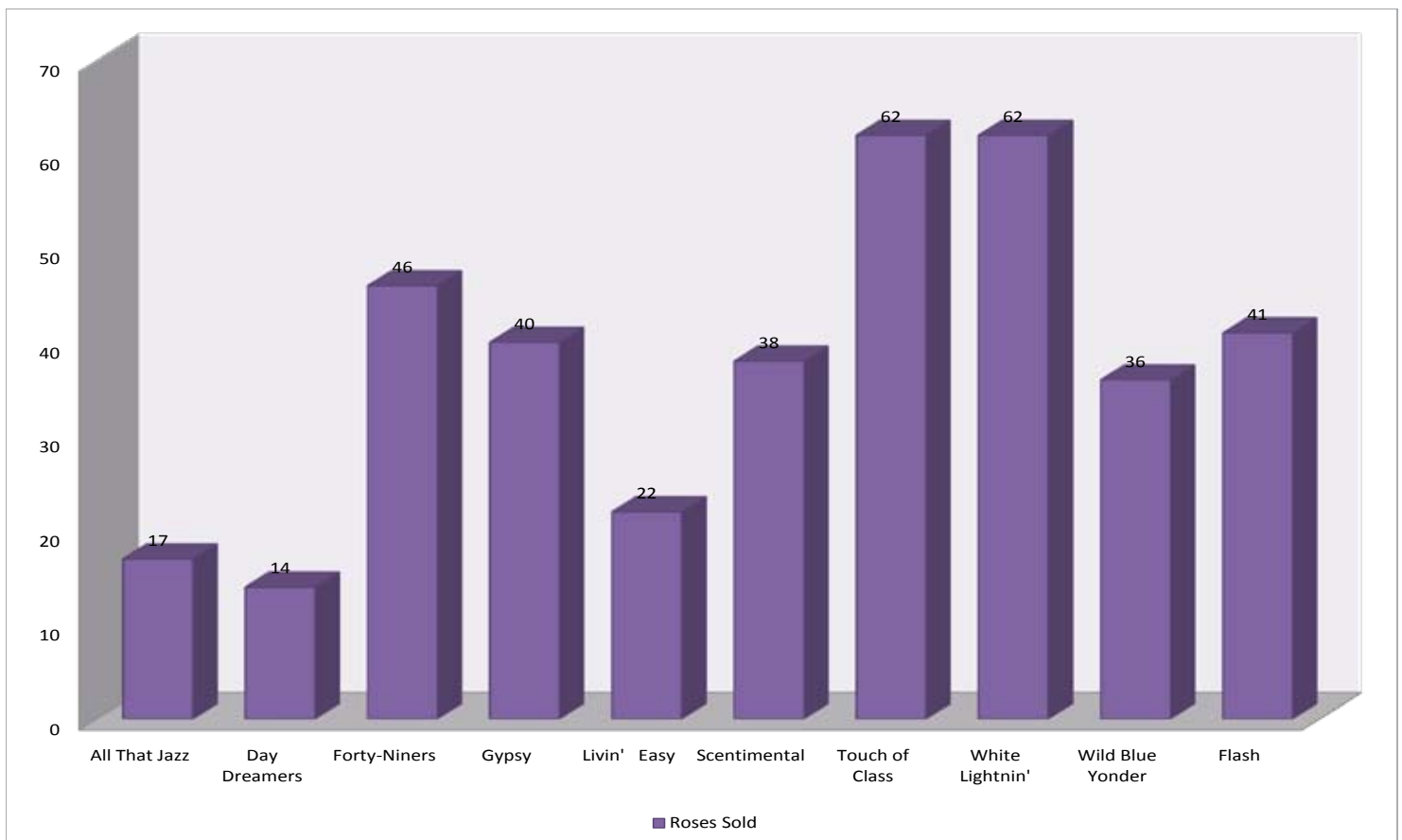
Kiwanis Rose Day A Success
