I soon became very reticent to say I was Kiwanian until I was actually giving something back to the community through various volunteer opportunities. To me, to say one is a Kiwanian means more than the fact that they attend a weekly meeting. It means they are involved in charitable work in the community, primarily for children. Our club does that extremely well with its own projects, but we all have opportunities to do more in other ways. Again, thank you. I am extremely humbled by the award."
